The award rewards outstanding trail projects that were funded through the Recreational Trails Program of the Federal Highway Administration. The award was presented by the Coalition for Recreation Trails. The Cary Bayou Trail connects Jenkins and Holloway Parks.

Baytown 2025 Comprehensive Plan

On May 22, 2007 City Council adopted the Baytown 2025 Comprehensive Plan. The Baytown 2025 Comprehensive Plan is an official public document that acts as a general guide for how the City should grow and operate over the next 20 years. The Comprehensive Plan plays many important roles in shaping the future of the community by:



- Serving as a general "blueprint" for future development (and redevelopment) in and around Baytown with an emphasis on improving the community's desirability as a place to live, work, play and shop;
- Documenting the character of the community, as well as anticipated issues, trends, opportunities, and challenges facing the City
- Providing a common vision supported by a series of goals and objectives for the next 20 years;
- Defining policies to guide daily decision-making regarding Baytown's physical and economic growth; and
- Establishing a core set of strategies for aggressive implementation that emphasizes action and results.
