## Smoking Ordinance

### Smoking is prohibited in:

- Enclosed public places;
- Enclosed places of employment;
- Seating areas of outdoor arenas, stadiums, and amphitheatres;
- Enclosed City-owned facilities;
- Vehicles, while used in the course of employment; and
- Any establishment, facility, or outdoor area declared as non-smoking by the person in control of property where properly signed.



### Smoking is allowed in the following places:

- Private residences, except when used as a child care, adult day care, or health care facility;
- Private vehicles, except when used in the course of employment;
- Hotel/motel rooms, designated as smoking rooms (not to exceed 20% of total rooms);
- Retail tobacco stores;
- Private and semi-private rooms, in nursing homes and long-term care facilities;
- Private clubs that have no employees;
- Outside areas (except within 15' of an entrance or in seating areas of outdoor arenas, stadiums and amphitheatres); and
- Areas designated in a hospital psychiatric unit.



## Baytown Citizen's Police Academy



### Accepting Applications for the Next Class Beginning the End of January or First of February.

Baytown Citizen's Police Academy is a unique learning experience conducted by the Police Department and designed to give citizens a better understanding of the operation and mission of their local Baytown Police Department.

Each week a different police related topic is covered, such as crime scene investigation, terrorism, traffic stops, DWI investigation, and hostage negotiations.

Participation in the academy is open to persons at least 18 years of age, who either live or work in the City of Baytown. Applications are screened for criminal history and driving records to assure the integrity of the class.

The course costs \$25 per person. The only other cost involved is the price of the graduation banquet meal, which concludes the academy. Attendance at the banquet is not mandatory.
