Building Safety - International Codes

Building safety is dependent on much more than a good designer or an experienced carpenter. It is the result of providing trained professionals with the necessary resources and ongoing support required to stay current with the latest advancements in the building safety field.

Every day more and more cities, counties and states in America are using the International Codes more than any other building code. Today, all 50 States and Washington, D.C., Puerto Rico, the Department of Defense and the National Park Service have adopted or are in the process of adopting one or more of the International Codes. Baytown is no exception

In 2001, City Council adopted the first edition of the International Codes. These codes go through a rigorous review cycle every three years. Remaining proactive, the council adopted the next edition in April of 2004. Over the last year, the Building Services staff and the Fire Services staff have performed a comprehensive review on the latest edition of the codes they enforce. On July 26, 2007 the City Council adopted the 2006 building codes and fire code with the exception of those provisions that must first be approved by the Planning and Zoning Commission.

In today's society many people don't give building safety a second thought. Some view building codes as cumbersome or just another government regulation. It is these codes that give our builders and inspectors the foundation for standards that safeguard our health, safety and welfare as it relates to building construction.
