



# EDDIE V. GRAY WETLANDS CENTER WADE INTO WETLANDS SUMMER SCIENCE CAMP

**Hands-on experiences in science and nature education for youth ages 9–15 (entering grades 4th–10th) and **NEW** ages 6-9 (entering grades 1st–3rd)**

**June 8-12 – Feathered Frenzy (4th-6th grade)**  
Campers learn bird biology, habitat, and i.d. techniques using binoculars and field guides through fun indoor activities and outdoor birding field trips.

**June 15-19 – Fishing Fanatics (6th-10th grade)**  
Junior Anglers learn fish biology, wetlands ecology, fishing techniques, sportsmanship, ethics and safety with fun indoor activities and fishing trips.

**June 22-26 **NEW** Crazy About Critters (1st-3rd grade)** Young campers focus on insects, fish, reptiles, birds and mammals with fun hands-on activities including a trip to the Houston Zoo.

**June 29–July 3 – Radical Reptiles (6th-10th grade)** Campers will enjoy this camp while learning about reptile biology, adaptations, and habitat through hands-on activities with live reptiles.

**July 6-10 – Survive Alive (4th-5th grade)**  
**July 13-17– Survivor Wild (6th-10th grade)**  
Campers will study animal biology, adaptations

and ecosystems during age appropriate indoor and outdoor activities including a trip to the Houston Zoo.

**July 20-24 – Working in the Wild (6th-10th grade)**  
Ever wonder what a game warden does? Campers will spend a week learning about outdoor career opportunities. Guest speakers and fun fieldtrips are planned.

**July 27-31 – Pioneer Pals (4th-5th grade)**  
Campers will visit the past to learn how settlers lived off the land. Activities will include spinning wool into yarn, milking a cow, making candles out of beeswax and playing Native American games.

**August 3-7 – Ocean Commotion (6th-10th grade)**  
Campers will explore oceanography by learning about marine animals, oil exploration, hurricanes and pollution. The week will end with a fun water activity.

**August 10-14 – Nature’s Art (6th-10th grade)**  
Aspiring artists create nature art projects with different mediums. Field trips to local art venues and wetland ecosystems inspire our own week-ending art show.

**All Camps are held Monday – Friday from 8:00 am – 4:00 pm.  
(Before and after-program extended hours are offered for a fee.)**

**Cost: \$100 per camper for each camp – includes field trips**
