CURBSIDE RECYCLING

Beginning in April or May, each single family and duplex residence will receive one, 18-gallon recycling container. Please place the container with the recyclables included at the curb or side of the street on your regular solid waste pick up days each week. The following materials may be placed in the recycling container: plastics (#1 and #2), aluminum metal cans, and newspaper. The materials do not need to be sorted but it is helpful if the newspapers are bagged or tied separately. The materials will be transported to a certified recycling facility where they will be sorted and recycled. The City does not receive revenue from the sale of recyclable materials. A recycling charge of \$2.25 plus tax will be included on the water bill and is mandatory for all single family and duplex properties. The charge will not appear on utility bills until the service begins. Residents who lose, damage, or desire additional recycling containers can purchase them from the City for \$6.50 plus tax by coming to the Utility Billing Office located at 2505 Market Street.

June 2-6 Feathered Frenzy (6th-10th grade)

Aspiring artists create nature art projects with different mediums. Field trips to local art venues and wetland ecosystems inspire our own week-ending art show.

July 28-August 1 Geology Rocks (6th-10th grade)

Amateur rock hounds will enjoy this study of the geologic history of Baytown. Campers identify minerals in the lab and go on lots of outdoor coastal area field labs.

August 4-8 Survivor Wild (6th-10th grade)

Campers will study animal biology, adaptations, ecosystems and tracks during indoor and outdoor activities ending the week with a trip to the Houston Zoo.

August 11-15 Ocean Commotion (6th-10th grade)

Campers will explore oceanography by learning about marine animals, hurricanes, oil exploration, and pollution. They will end the week with a fun water activity.
