Types of Food Service Establishments

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High Risk- Establishment means an operation that prepares and sells/serves potentially hazardous food, such as, but not limited to; restaurants, cafeterias, fast-food restaurants, hospitals, schools, daycares, and grocery stores that pre-package potentially hazardous food on site.

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Medium Risk – Establishment means an operation that sells/serves pre-packaged potentially hazardous food and/or prepares limited types of food such as, but not limited to; grocery stores, convenience stores that heat and serve deli type food (hot dogs, sausage, etc.) and/or package ice.

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Low Risk - Establishment means an operation that sells/serves only pre-packaged non-potentially hazardous food or whole uncut produce such as, but not limited to; convenience stores, bars, and establishments that serve only pre-packaged, non-potentially hazardous food.

Potentially hazardous food means any food that consists in whole or in part of milk or milk products, eggs, meat, poultry, fish, shellfish, edible crustacean, or other ingredients including synthetic ingredients, in a form capable of supporting rapid and progressive growth of infectious or toxigenic microorganisms. The term does include clean, whole, uncracked, odor-free shell eggs. The term does not include foods, which have a pH level of 4.6 or below, or a water activity (Aw) value of 0.85 or less.
