On March 1, 2008, City Council conducted a work session to discuss the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats facing the community. The City Council's work session was followed up with community work sessions on March 25, 2008, to determine the citizens' ideas on the community's strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats. ## Citizens' Bond Advisory Committee

The Citizens Bond Advisory Committee (CBAC) was formed by City Council to assist with the implementation of the \$79.5 million bond program approved by voters in November 2007. This 13-member committee meets regularly to review the status of bond-related projects, to provide recommendations to staff, and to consider endorsing bond elements when they are ready for City Council consideration. The CBAC has already reviewed qualification information for possible designers of the Pinehurst/ Chambers County Fire Station and two drainage projects, and is reviewing the design for the Family Aquatics Center at the Wayne Gray Sports Complex. Future meetings will begin the discussion of street reconstruction, a major portion of the 6-year bond program.
